As new students to the school they were not aware of using IPads, Apps and SMH but it was not as stressful as I thought it would be. We had happy students coming back to school. The Year 10 & 11 are on it! They have great confidence with emailing queries and questions over for support.

6. The Teaching Experience

BSR Did not have access to the pre reading Staff Voice Document. (DCL) Challenging start to the year. Logistics with SLT meetings, one-way system around the school and cleaning of areas, however we have coped with it brilliantly and adapted to change.

(KG) How has it been with students that need 121/TA support? (DCL) This has been raised at staff meeting to address and look at seating plans with putting SEN and vulnerable students at the front of the class. Most cases were actioned.

(LMI) Taking pictures in class and sending via email within class time is a contactless approach I have found useful. This also causes no embarrassment to students who are struggling as this is communication only with them and the teacher.

(DW) Observed lessons, blended learning – Hard work. Struggling with non-contact in construction, but we are copying with changes and finding ways around it. With demonstration its taking lots of explain. Recording demos is useful but updated technology needs to be used.

(KG) Sop there is still barriers but solutions coming through. How is staff moral? (DCL) Carry on the same after COVID ie no way system, no morning meetings, students bring own equipment as currently can't use school ones. No parent's evenings or Open Evenings is less stress for staff.

(CC) Good to see two different angles and methods of working remotely from two different members of staff.

(MWI) Could Governor meetings carry on remotely in the future? (RG) We are realigning on technology that isn't always working. (KG) Perhaps 1 face to face get to know each other than remote for the rest of the academic year?
