

Welcome

I hope all families had an enjoyable and restful Easter break. I would like to wish those of you celebrating Eid today a joyous and memorable time with loved ones. Eid Mubarak!

As many of you will know, the next industrial strike action planned by the NEU looks like it will go ahead on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May 2023. Parents can find the NEU explanation of their dispute with the government here; [leaflet](#) and [campaign](#).

The teaching unions sought to settle this matter through negotiation but the government's offer failed to sufficiently address pay and conditions, and, critically, did not provide enough funding to support the proposal it put forward. The proposal required schools to provide 4.5% of the wage increase from existing budgets, with only 0.5% coming from additional funding from the government. This would have a significant and detrimental impact on Bosworth Academy's budget, particularly on our staffing levels, curriculum offer, resources and wider enrichment that we provide for our children. Following the rejection of the offer by all education unions involved; ASCL, NAHT, NEU and NASUWT, the government has not reopened negotiations and has said only that the issue of pay will now revert to the School Teachers' Review Body.

Other unions are now moving towards a formal ballot reflecting the fact that we have reached a desperate situation in education regarding inadequate funding, long-term pay erosion, and teacher shortages as well as retention challenges.

For these two strike days the NEU have shared dispensation guidance to be agreed with Headteachers to minimise disruption to Year 11/13 exam preparation. In my discussions with our NEU representatives we agreed that striking NEU teachers will set revision activities or exam practice for students, including for our Year 12 students, who in most cases are sitting AS examinations.

With an increase in NEU membership in school, in consultation with the Governing Body I have once again made the difficult decision to restrict attendance to school for some year groups. Due to the expected numbers of teachers taking industrial action we can only open safely for the following year groups who are in their examination year;

On Thursday 27th April 2023 - students in Years 11, 12 and 13 must attend school as normal.

On Tuesday 2nd May 2023 - students in Years 11, 12 and 13 must attend school as normal.

Our teaching and support staff will look to ensure that there is good quality learning taking place for these students in school and there will be specialist subject support still available in nearly all classes. On previous industrial strike days the attendance of students matched a normal day at 95% and we expect this to continue for these two days given the proximity of formal examinations.

The calendared coursework examinations for Art & Design students will go ahead as planned on the strike days. Remote learning tasks will once again be set with support resources on the Google Classroom in a variety of subjects for each year group. Links to this learning will be shared with parents as well as students in a separate communication so you can discuss this with your child.

Remote education at home:

On Thursday 27th April 2023 students in **Years 7, 8, 9 and 10** are **expected to learn from home.**

On Tuesday 2nd May 2023 - students in **Years 7, 8, 9 and 10** are **expected to learn from home.**

Vulnerable students and those who are entitled to free school meals will be contacted separately about the arrangements.

I understand the impact and disruption that this action will cause year groups working remotely and I know it will cause you inconvenience and difficulties. I again thank you in advance for your support and understanding during this difficult, disruptive period, and hope that a resolution can be found soon to prevent this disruption and avert these upcoming strikes. If the situation changes I will of course let you know next week.

Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality at school and to lessons is essential for students to achieve their full educational potential. It is also vital for students to form good habits for later life. Punctuality records form part of references passed onto employers or higher educational institutes. Punctuality at Bosworth Academy is good and I thank you for working together with us to achieve this.

Expectations:

- The school day begins at 8.40am and all students are expected to be in school for their lesson by this time, regardless of the distance they may have to travel. Students who arrive after 8.40am, will have a detention issued (unless they travel on the 153 or the school bus is late). Students arriving after this time must sign in at the attendance office.
- The School operates the Truancy Call System to notify parents/carers if their child has not arrived in school.
- Parents/carers can help by notifying us in advance about planned absences, and arrange medical or dental appointments outside the school day, where possible.
- Bosworth Academy requests that parents/carers contact the School by 9.00am to let us know if their son/daughter is going to be absent.
- Parents/carers are strongly advised to avoid taking their children on holiday during term time and requests during term time will not be authorised. Fines can be issued for holidays taken during term time. Please be aware that there are assessments and trial exams throughout the academic year for all year groups.

Lateness to Lessons:

- Any student arriving to lessons after the register has been taken will be classed as 'late'. The register will be marked with the 'L' code.
- If the student doesn't have a valid explanation of their lateness to the lesson, the teacher will record in the behaviour section on Arbor as 'Late to lesson'.
- As a result of being late to the lessons three times in a week the sanctions will include, but are not limited to, the student losing their break time or lunchtime for one day but could be extended to up to a week for persistent offenders.

Stephen Lawrence Day

Stephen Lawrence Day is on Saturday 22 April and Bosworth Academy will be reflecting on the part we all play in creating a society in which



everyone can flourish. It is an opportunity for young people to have their voices heard and create a society that treats everyone with fairness and respect. Through Stephen Lawrence Day we want young people to be inspired about what

they can achieve in their own lives whether in their classroom, their community or a career. We want them to get involved in creating the kind of community they want to live in and we want them to have a strong voice in building a fairer and more inclusive society.

Stephen Lawrence was 18 and studying for A-levels with aspirations to become an architect when on Thursday 22 April 1993 he was surrounded by a group of white youths and attacked. Stephen was later pronounced dead on arrival at hospital with two five-inch-deep stab wounds to his arm and chest.

As Stephen Lawrence Day is on a Saturday this year we will be remembering him throughout the following week in tutor intervention and will have a dedicated assembly on Friday 28 April led by Stephen Lawrence Ambassadors. **On the same day we encourage everyone to wear an orange item of clothing with orange being Stephen's favourite colour.**

Students will be able to choose to substitute ONE piece of uniform for an orange item. The options are to swap:

1. Tie
2. Shirt (with a collar to wear a tie)
3. V-necked jumper
4. Ribbons in hair
5. Socks
6. Shoe laces

The rest of the clothing must be in line with the uniform policy. There should be no t-shirts, jeans, hooded jumpers etc.

Maths Puzzle of the Week

Calling all Bosworth Mathematicians! This week's Maths puzzle is here and anyone can enter. All you need to do is to write your solution and any working on a piece of paper and place it in the labelled blue boxes outside the Maths office with your name on or email a photo to hbarrowcliffe@bosworthacademy.org.uk. Below is the answer to last week's conundrum as well as this week's puzzle.

Answer: 243

I find this puzzle really interesting. After trying a few sets of numbers I noticed:


- Using a 1 is just a waste of a number. It adds nothing to the product of your numbers but just means you have less of your 15 left to use.
- Using more numbers is (up to a point) better than having larger numbers.

With that in mind, the largest possible product when you use 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 or 7 numbers is

Quantity of numbers used	Sum	Product
1	15 = 15	15 = 15
2	8 + 7 = 15	8 x 7 = 56
3	5 + 5 + 5 = 15	5 * 5 * 5 = 125
4	4 + 4 + 4 + 3 = 15	4 x 4 x 4 x 3 = 192
5	3 + 3 + 3 + 3 + 3 = 15	3 x 3 x 3 x 3 x 3 = 243
6	3 + 3 + 3 + 2 + 2 = 15	3 x 3 x 3 x 2 x 2 = 216
7	3 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 = 15	3 x 2 x 2 x 2 x 2 x 2 = 192

The product peaks when five numbers are used before getting smaller again, so the maximum possible product is 243.

Bosworth Maths Puzzle of the Week



James puts the numbers 1 to 19 into this beehive shape.

Each row, in all directions, adds to make 38.

Hint: the top row is a good place to start.

What number must go in the red hexagon?

Extension: Can you make your own magic hexagon which is different to James' puzzle?




Revision Masterclasses




Book Recommendations

Key Stage Three



A twist on the Medusa myth, which tells of the ill-fated love between the cursed Medusa and mysterious Perseus.

Exiled to a far-flung island by the whims of the gods, Medusa has little company except the snakes that adorn her head instead of hair.

But when a charmed, beautiful boy called Perseus arrives on the island, her lonely existence is disrupted with the force of a supernova, unleashing desire, love and betrayal... Filled with glorious full-colour illustrations by award-winning Olivia Lomenech Gill, this astonishing retelling of Greek myth is perfect for readers of *Circe* and *The Silence of the Girls*. Illuminating the girl behind the legend, it brings alive Medusa for a new generation.
