I can provide an overview of the impressions presented in the extract.			
I can track through the text chronologically.			
I can use words from the question in my points.			
I can make 3-5 different points across the section.			
I can support each point with a short quotation.			
I can analyse the language/techniques used in the quotations.			
I can analyse or comment on the structure and/or tone of the section.			
I can link to the effect on the reader.			
<b>Question 3 and 4: how question</b>			
I can use the correct section of the text.			
I can provide an overview of the section of the text.			
I can track through the text chronologically.			
I can use words from the question in my points.			
I can make 6-8 different points across the section.			
I can support each point with a short quotation.			
I can analyse the language/techniques used in the quotations.			
I can analyse or comment on the structure and/or tone of the section.			

I can link to the effect on the reader.			
I can refer to subject terminology and its effects.			
<b>Question 5: evaluate question</b>			
I can refer to the text as a whole.			
I can track through the text chronologically.			
I can provide an opinion explaining to what extent I agree and consistently refer to my opinion throughout my answer.			
I can use words from the question in my points.			
I can make 6-8 different points across the text.			
I can support each point with a short quotation.			
I can analyse the language/techniques used in the quotations.			
I can analyse or comment on the structure/tone of the section.			
I can link to the effect on the reader.			
I can refer to subject terminology and its effects.			
I can make a value judgement at the end, summarising to what extent I agree with the statement.
