I can understand a range of poems, showing this through a summary of what the poem is about.			
I can select 6-8 quotations from the poem to write about.			
I can write 3-4 ideas about the poem.			
I can write something about the beginning, middle and end of the poem.

I embed quotations within my sentence, using at least one quotation or example per paragraph.			
I show a clear understanding of the poem in my writing.			
I can comment on and explore the effects of structure.			
I can identify, explore and analyse the effects of literary techniques used by the poet.

I explore the effects on the reader, offering a personal point of view.

I can write an introduction that explains how the poems link/contrast.			
I can make 3-4 comparisons (similarities, contrasts or a mix of both) about the presentation of theme or poetic devices/structure.			
I write about both poems in my response.			
I introduce my ideas using clear topic sentences.			

I use at least one comparative connective per paragraph to show that I understand similarities and differences.			
I embed quotations within my sentence, using at least one quotation or example per paragraph.			
I show a clear understanding of the poems in my writing.			
I can comment on and explore the effects of structure.			
I can identify, explore and analyse the effects of literary techniques used by the poets, comparing the effects, when appropriate.			
I can form original interpretations and offer alternative interpretations.			
I explore the effects on the reader.			
I evaluate, discuss and compare the poet's intentions in writing the poem (what are their purpose?... what messages are they conveying?)...)			
I can write a conclusion that sums up why and how the poem's different, offering a personal response.
