Many of our students from every year group joined us as Ambassadors for the evening. Ambassadors guided visitors around the school, answered many questions and led subject demonstrations right across our curriculum. Year 7 students, fairly new to Bosworth themselves, excelled as they guided parents and children around our site. I was filled with pride, hearing how they described their school and in the confidence they showed throughout the evening. Four students from our Student Leadership Group, Abdul M, Amara M, Molly D V and Sahib A spoke to large audiences in our two presentations with skill and great enthusiasm.



On Thursday 30 October we will be holding our Sixth Form Open Evening. This event is aimed at students in Year 11 who are considering their next steps in Post-16. Bosworth Academy Sixth Form, The Oaks, is a vibrant, highly aspirational choice - with a large range of AS/A levels available for students to study. We are proud of our Post-16 student achievement and the progress that they make beyond Bosworth. This summer, once again, our outcomes were exceptionally high for Leicestershire Post-16, and in the top 25% nationally. Our Sixth Form of approximately 400 students enrol from

Bosworth Academy, as well as a range of local 11-16 schools who join our year 12. Please come and join us to see the wealth of opportunities and provision that will be available for your young person.

Last Friday we celebrated the European Day of Languages with a range of activities. Flags from around the world have been displayed to not only represent different languages but also reflect the diverse backgrounds which make up the student and staff community at Bosworth Academy. At Bosworth Academy, the vast majority of our students study a language to GCSE. Language qualifications open many doors in life and importantly exposes students to different cultures, helping them develop a global perspective and an understanding of the diversity in the world. This is linked to our global competency 6C Citizenship, fostering empathy, respect, and open-mindedness toward other cultures and traditions.

Attendance at school is high across all year groups at Bosworth. I cannot stress enough how vital it is that all of our children attend school regularly. Research clearly shows that missed learning has a direct impact on student outcomes. Over the next two weeks as we reach half-term we will be rewarding those students who have high attendance. Please talk to your child about the importance of school and the impact of missing lessons. Consistent attendance leads to improved learning progress, while also helping students develop essential skills like reliability and confidence.

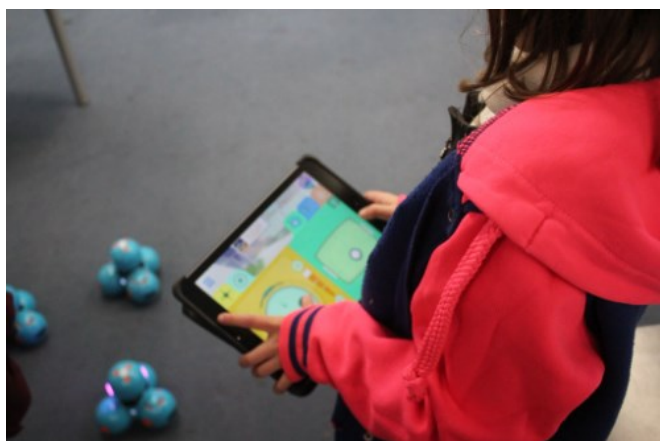
Open Evening Showcase

We thank all those who attended and we look forward to seeing you start Year 7 next year.



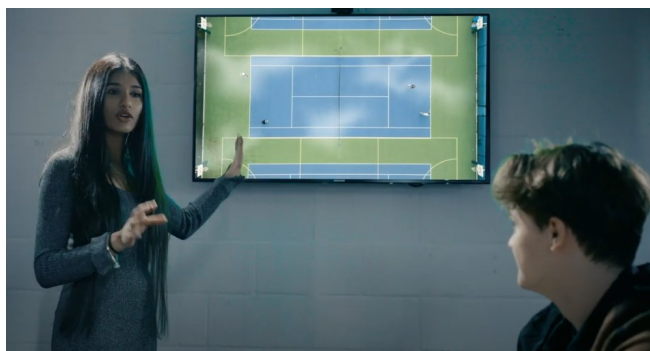
Sixth Form Open Evening

Our students continue to outperform with A Level exam results being consistently above national and regional averages with A*-E grades at 100% however we believe that developing character and values is as important as exam results.

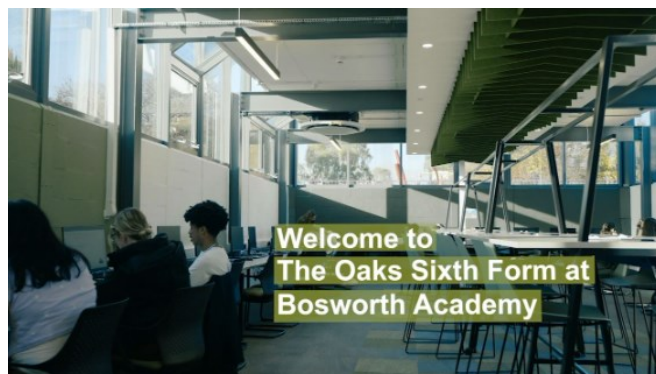

Beacon Hill Y8 Fieldwork

This week saw our Year 8 Geography students heading out to Beacon Hill to complete a fieldwork experience to understand why Beacon Hill is important.

Beacon Hill is about to step out onto the world stage with an application for a prestigious international designation. The famously scenic area, home to some of the oldest animal fossils in the world, will be applying for **UNESCO Global Geopark** status later this year. If successful, it would become the county's first site with a coveted UNESCO status.



This has been a fantastic opportunity for our Year 8 students as Dr Jack Matthews, Geopark Geoheritage Officer said: "Since the discovery of our famous fossil *Charnia* by two schoolchildren in the 1950s, Charnwood Forest has been one of our planet's most important places to visit and understand how animals first evolved.

Upon returning to school students will be creating 'Beacon Hill in a Box' which is an opportunity for them to demonstrate their 8 way thinking skills. Well done to all the Year 8 students who attended what a great experience had by everyone.

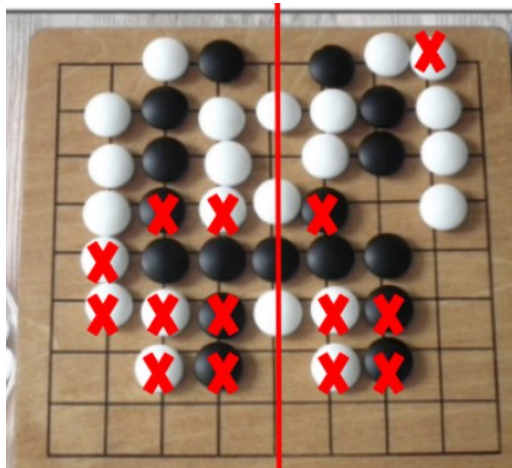

What is the fewest number of stones you would need to remove from this board so that the remaining stones have reflectional symmetry? The colour of the stones must also be symmetrical.



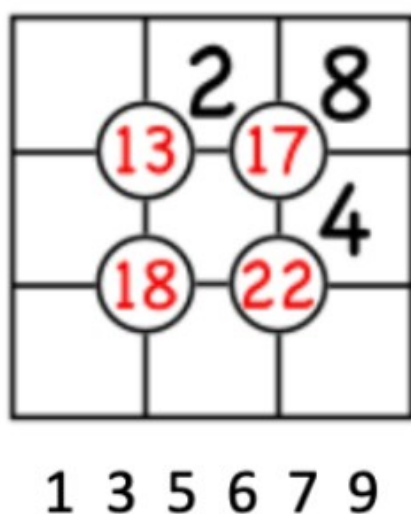

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about EA SPORTS FC 26

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Our guide looks at the risks surrounding EA Sports FC 26 and our top tips to minimise them. This marks the third year since EA left the FIFA licence, and the game is mostly unchanged from last year. While Kick-Off mode is great for playing with friends and Career Mode allows players to fulfil long-term ambitions as a manager or player, Ultimate Team remains the main draw for many players – and it can get out of hand in terms of how much money players can invest.

AN ANNUAL RELEASE SCHEDULE

As was the case with the last two EA Sports FC games and the FIFA series before it, the franchise rolls out once a year with updated squads and new features. This can make it expensive to keep up with, particularly when so many dedicated players are keen to get their hands on the latest edition.

VOICE CHAT

Voice chat can be enabled across all platforms, meaning young people can speak to anyone they play with or against. While it can be switched off, some children will no doubt want to speak to their friends while they play. This also means they may encounter strangers much older than them, which can expose them to inappropriate language or behaviours.

IN-GAME PURCHASES THROUGH ULTIMATE TEAM

Ultimate Team is the big draw for EA Sports FC, letting players spend real money on packs that they can open to build a squad of the world's best players. They're not always easy to obtain, and new, improved versions of players will be regularly added as limited-time offerings. Young people could feel pressured into spending money and experience fear of missing out.

SCAMMERS IN ULTIMATE TEAM

Ultimate Team is managed by EA itself, but that hasn't stopped scammers from looking to dupe players out of money and in-game coins. Some scammers sell their accounts, which is a violation of EA's terms of service, while others will 'sell' coins – something the developer is still working to crack down on. Some try to gain access to others' accounts, potentially giving them access to payment information.

POTENTIAL FOR ADDICTION

While EA Sports FC is potentially addictive, thanks to its fast-paced gameplay and mirroring of the real-world skill and glamour of football, Ultimate Team's focus on limited-time rewards and the lottery of winning packs can make it feel closer to gambling than gaming, which may lead to addiction and impulsive spending of money.

Advice for Parents & Educators

PREPARE FOR ANOTHER GAME IN A YEAR

The annual-release cadence aligns with the return of the school year, and can be a great way to incentivise good behaviour at the start of term. If children are applying themselves and preparing for a new year of school, or were particularly well behaved in the summer, EA Sports FC 26 could make a great reward.

LIMIT SPENDING

If you're worried about children accidentally spending real money in Ultimate Team, whether in game or on the EA Sports FC companion app, don't link a payment card to their account. Reclaiming funds can be a mountain to climb, and the dopamine hit of opening flashy packs with slick animations means one purchase can lead to another very quickly. It's also worth adding a prepaid card if you'd prefer them to make their own choices with their budget.

MONITOR VOICE CHAT

As in-game chat is open, be sure to adjust the settings in EA Sports FC 26 to lock it down. If children want to chat with their friends while they play, consider setting up a safe space for them to call, to allow them to play without fear of outsiders.

BE VIGILANT

As with last year, there are ways to keep scammers at bay. Ensure passwords are locked down, and consider using a password manager application to keep them secure. EA will never contact players through the game itself, so be vigilant with incoming messages, and block and report suspected spam. EA will contact players by email if needed, but they will never ask for usernames or passwords. Players should also avoid buying in-game currency from unofficial websites – doing so can lead to accounts being banned and could cost players money in the process.

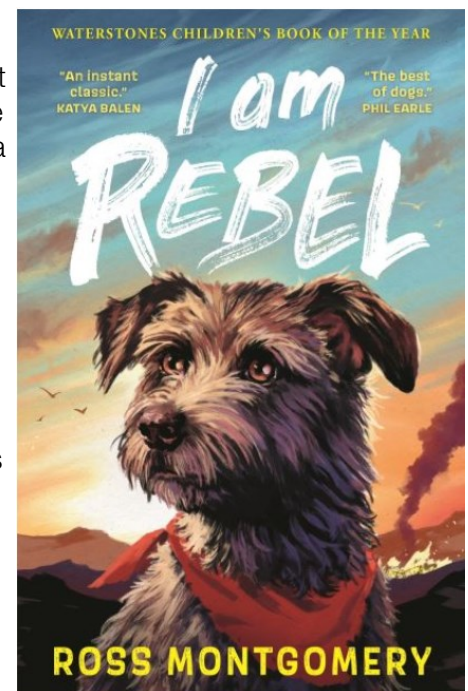

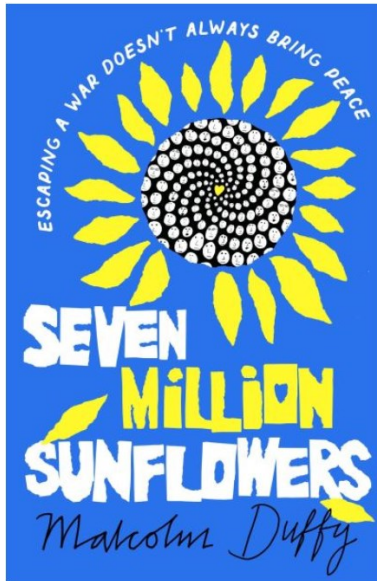
