This has been a very busy week at Bosworth Academy with many year groups revising hard and sitting their G CSE, AS or A level exams. We hope that students feel supported with the revision timetable and masterclasses

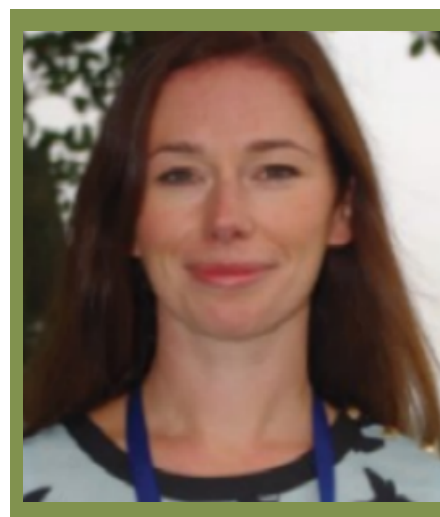

Please also note the national exam contingency day on 24th June, held in reserve should any exam papers be compromised or extreme circumstances occur. For A level students they should continue to attend their lessons until the exam for that subject has been completed. If you need any support to guide your child's revision please do not hesitate to contact.

In sports news, it has been a fantastic season for our basketball teams competing in the National JrNBA League for Schools. Our Year 7 team has secured their playoff spot after finishing 3rd in their league, while our Year 8 team remains undefeated, marking them as one of the standout teams in this year's competition. Both teams continue to train with determination making full use of our excellent courts and ensuring every detail is perfected. As the competition progresses, we may face schools from further afield - an exciting challenge and a brilliant opportunity for our students to shine.

We are pleased to invite students to this year's May Half Term Revision Academy, running from Tuesday 26th to Friday 29th May. 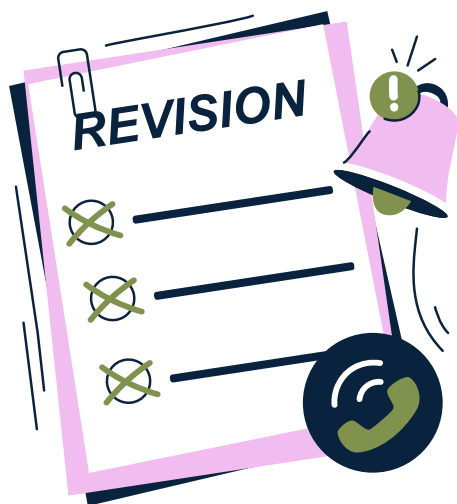

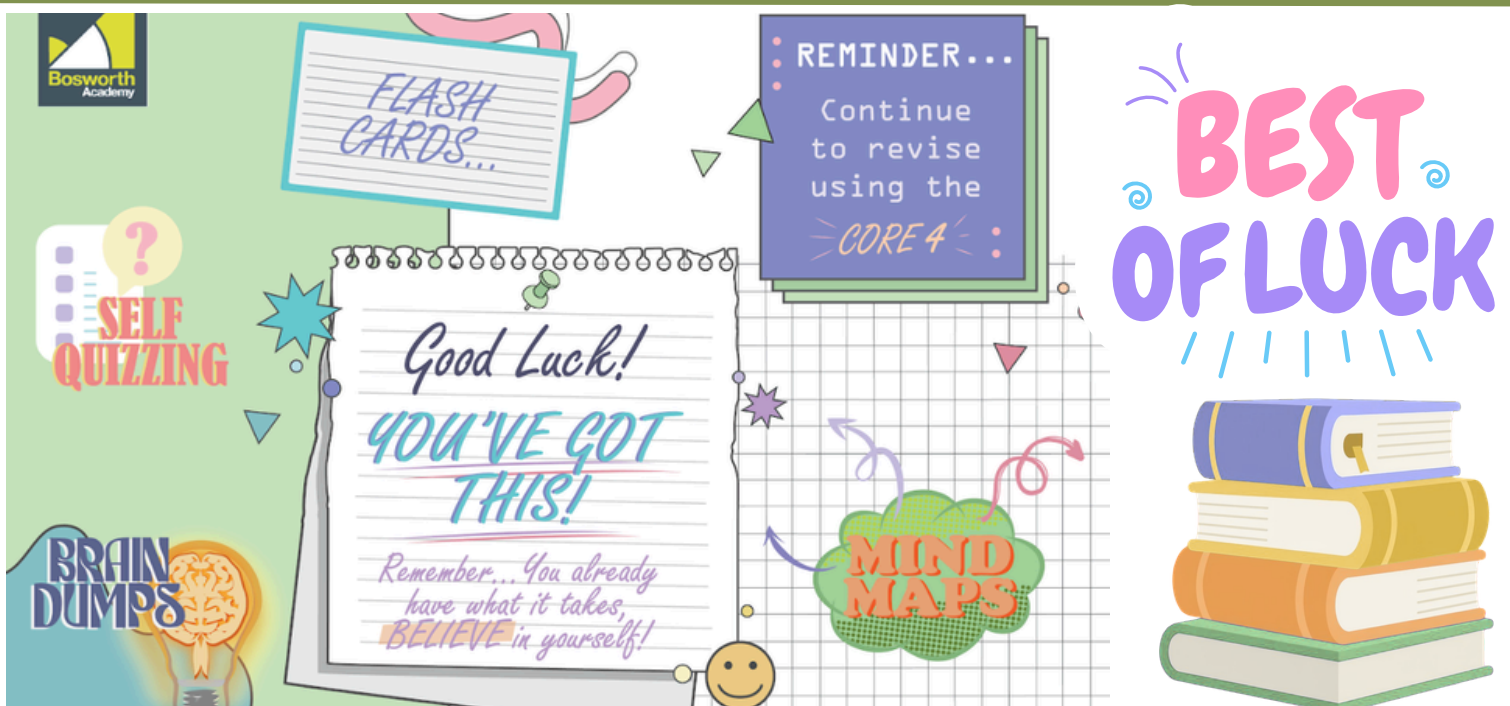
Personalised Timetables:

Starting on the week beginning 5th May **all Year 11 students** will receive their personalised revision timetables which will be available to view on their Arbour calendar – carefully designed to help them make the most of the final weeks before exams. Each timetable includes a blend of students' usual lessons alongside targeted revision sessions in subjects, ensuring every learner has the opportunity to strengthen **understanding and build confidence** ahead of the summer assessments.

These tailored schedules have been created to allow students to focus on topics that will make the biggest difference to their exam preparation. Students **MUST** look at their Arbour timetable to see what subjects they have and when. It will also give them the room they need to go to.

The final day for year 11 to attend is **Wednesday June 10th**. After this date students will need to come in for their personalised lesson/revision sessions and exams only. A reminder that the exam contingency day is **24th June** - this is put in place in case any exam papers are compromised nationally or in case of extreme circumstances such as extreme heatwave.

Junior Maths Challenge

On **Wednesday 29th of April** 77 students in year 7 and 8 took part in the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge. This is a competition held every year to challenge some of the country's top young mathematicians, they are set 25 challenging questions that they have to figure out without a calculator, using their minds and only a blank piece of paper to help.

This year's results are in and they are some of our best ever!

45 of our students have achieved either bronze, silver or gold certificates:

Ethan, Harman, Eben and Avaani all qualified for the follow on rounds, with Ethan in the Mathematical Olympiad and Harman, Eben and Avaani into the kangaroo so a big **congratulations to these three!** Details of follow-on rounds will go out to students soon.

5. **Do not expect to finish the whole paper in the time allowed**. The questions in this paper have been arranged in approximate order of difficulty with the harder questions towards the end. You are not expected to complete all the questions during the time. You should bear this in mind when deciding which questions to tackle.
6. **Scoring rules:**
5 marks are awarded for each correct answer to Questions 1-15;
6 marks are awarded for each correct answer to Questions 16-25.
There is no penalty for giving an incorrect answer.
7. **Your Answer Sheet will be read by a machine**. Do not write or doodle on the sheet except to mark your chosen options. The machine will read all markings even if they are in the wrong places. If you mark the sheet in the wrong place, doodle, or leave bits of eraser stuck to the page, the machine will interpret the mark in its own way.
8. **The questions on this paper are designed to challenge you to think, not to guess**. You will gain more marks, and more satisfaction, by doing one question carefully than by guessing lots of answers. This paper is about solving interesting problems, not about lucky guessing.
9. To accommodate candidates sitting at other times, please do not discuss the paper on the internet until **08:00 BST on Friday 1st May**, when the solutions video will be released at ukmt.org.uk/competition-papers. Candidates in time zones more than 2 hours ahead of GMT must sit the paper on Thursday 30th April (as defined locally).

Year 9 Students Explore “Why Higher Education?”

Recently, a group of Year 9 students attended an engaging and informative talk delivered by the University of Leicester titled “Why Higher Education?”.

The session aimed to **raise aspirations** and introduce students to the opportunities available through higher education from an early stage. Students explored what university life is like, the wide range of courses available, and the skills that can be developed through further study.

A key focus of the talk was helping students understand how the choices they made, particularly their GCSE options, can influence **future pathways and university opportunities**.

By making these links clear, students were encouraged to think carefully and confidently about their next steps.

The session also helped bridge the gap between school and higher education by providing practical information and reducing some of the uncertainty students may have about university. Hearing about student life and post-16 pathways gave pupils valuable insight into **future possibilities** and highlighted that higher education can be an achievable goal for everyone.

Wake-Up Wednesday - Age-Inappropriate Content

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ONLINE GROOMING

Online grooming is when someone builds a relationship with a child or young person online to gain their trust for the purpose of sexual abuse, exploitation, radicalisation, or criminal activity – such as county lines or financial scams. According to the NSPCC, police in the UK recorded over 7,000 offences involving sexual communication with a child in a single year – an increase of 89% since 2017/18.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

STRANGERS USING FAKE IDENTITIES

Groomers often pose as children or teenagers online to build trust. They may create convincing fake profiles, share photos stolen from real people, or mimic the interests of the child. By pretending to be someone their age, they make conversations feel safe and relatable. Over time, they may ask for personal details, photos, or suggest meeting in person, exposing children to significant emotional and physical harm.

EXPLOITATION THROUGH GIFTS AND FLATTERY

To gain trust quickly, groomers often send gifts, gaming credits, or money. Alongside material offerings, they use excessive compliments, affection, and attention to create emotional dependency. These tactics make children feel valued and special, lowering their defences. Once trust is secured, groomers may escalate their requests, often asking for photos or private conversations, making the child feel pressured or indebted to continue.

GROUP CHATS AS HIDDEN PATHWAYS

Unmonitored group chats on platforms like WhatsApp or Discord provide a cover for groomers. They can watch how children interact, identify those who seem vulnerable, and then move conversations into private messaging. This transition makes detection difficult for trusted adults. The seemingly harmless group setting often masks the presence of predators, giving children a false sense of security.

THE RISE OF SEXTORTION

Sextortion involves pressuring children into sharing explicit content, then blackmailing them for more. Offenders may claim to have hacked a child's device, threaten to share images with friends or family, or demand money. Many victims remain silent out of fear and shame. This growing crime is particularly dangerous because children often feel trapped, believing there's no safe way to escape the situation.

GAMING PLATFORMS AS GROOMING GATEWAYS

Games like Roblox, Fortnite, or Call of Duty, which include live chat features, are frequent targets for groomers. Conversations often begin casually during gameplay and can become manipulative over time. Groomers may offer in-game gifts, credits, or exclusive add-ons to build rapport. Children using headsets or private chat features are especially at risk, as conversations are harder for adults to monitor.

CRIMINAL & RADICALISATION RISKS

Grooming is not always sexual. Some offenders manipulate children into criminal activities such as drug running or online fraud. Others attempt to radicalise young people with extreme ideologies. Groomers often use fear, money, shame, or promises of belonging to control their victims. These forms of exploitation can be just as harmful as sexual grooming, and often leave lasting psychological and social consequences.

Advice for Parents & Educators

KEEP CONVERSATIONS REGULAR

Rather than having one "big talk" about online safety, weave conversations into everyday life. Ask questions about children's online friendships and interests. Share real-life examples to make discussions relatable and encourage honesty instead of secrecy. When children feel comfortable discussing their digital lives, they are far more likely to share concerns or admit when something feels wrong, reducing the chance of risky interactions going unnoticed.

CREATE A "TELL ME" CULTURE

Children often keep silent because they fear being punished or losing access to their devices. Reassure them that coming forward with concerns won't get them into trouble. Emphasise that you are there to help, not judge. Creating a safe, open environment encourages children to speak up if something feels wrong, and helps to ensure they don't suffer in silence when facing potential grooming risks.

UNDERSTAND THE PLATFORMS CHILDREN USE

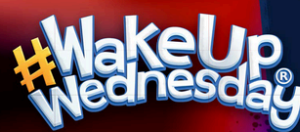
Take time to learn about the apps, games, and social platforms children are on. Familiarise yourself with privacy settings, parental controls, and group chat features. Use resources like The National College guides or conduct quick searches to stay updated. By understanding how these platforms operate, you'll be better equipped to set boundaries, guide safe use, and notice any unusual or concerning online behaviour early.

STAY ALERT TO WARNING SIGNS

Be attentive to both behavioural and digital red flags. Sudden secrecy, mood swings, or new online contacts may signal a problem. Watch for unexplained gifts, new social media profiles, or changes in sleep patterns. Increased anxiety or reluctance to attend school can also be indicators. Regularly checking in and showing interest in those whom they communicate with online help prevent small issues from escalating into serious risks.
